Garden Dialogues 2018: Twenty for Twenty Pasadena, CA

Register now for an exclusive insider's tour of the Hindry House's garden, originally designed by landscape architect Courtland Paul. The house was designed by the seminal Pasadena architects (and brothers) Arthur and Alfred Heineman in 1910 at the height of the California Arts and Crafts movement. Overlooking the Arroyo Seco in Pasadena's historic Prospect Park neighborhood, the idyllic enclave on just over one acre exemplifies the regional Craftsman style in both its architecture and its landscape. In the late 1960s, Paul designed what has been described as "an old swimmin' hole" surrounded by California sycamores. Boulders from the nearby Arroyo surround the pool. The widely published project was one of the first "natural-style" pools in the country. In 2014 Lisa Gimmy Landscape Architecture (LGLA) was engaged to document and rehabilitate the property's landscape.
